2. Play some music by ear just to hear what you want it to sound like. Then you can start to write down notes.

- 3. Your piece must be at least 8 measures long.
- 4. On your music you must include all of these things. Look on your school music for examples.
 - a. Clef
 - b. Key signature
 - c. Time signature (make sure you have the correct number of beats in every measure)
 - d. Dynamics
 - e. Bowings (only where something must be changed, not every note)
 - f. Articulations
 - g. Title
 - h. Composer's name (that's you!) in the upper right corner

- 6. Optional: If you want to challenge yourself, write a song for more than one instrument.

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
